New Jersey Bather Rules

- 1. Any person showing evidence of any communicable skin disease, sore or inflamed eyes, cold, nasal or ear discharges, or any other communicable disease shall be denied admission.
- 2. Any person with excessive sunburn, open blisters, cuts, or bandages shall be denied admission.
- 3. Do not enter the water if you are experiencing or recovering from diarrhea or have had signs or symptoms of a gastrointestinal disease in the past 7 days.
- 4. All children wearing diapers must wear plastic pants with snug fitting elastic waist and leg bands. Do not wash out soiled diapers in bathing water.
- 5. Children should be encouraged to use the restroom before entering the water. Immediately report any "accidents" you observe in the bathing waters to the pool attendant.
- 6. No animals, except for service animals, shall be allowed in the swimming pool or pool area.
- 7. Glass containers not permitted.
- 8. All persons shall shower before entering the pool water.
- 9. Conduct which endangers the safety and comfort of others shall be prohibited.
- 10. Outdoor bathing shall be prohibited during an electrical storm.
